

BACKGROUND

BC's *Public Interest Disclosure Act* (PIDA) is provincial legislation that provides a safe, legally protected way for current and former Health Quality BC employees to report serious or systemic wrongdoing. The Act came into force June 1, 2024 for Health Quality BC.

On June 1, 2024, Health Quality BC launched its PIDA reporting program and internal procedures to fulfill its obligations under the Act. Employees and former employees may seek advice or report wrongful or unlawful conduct in a confidential reporting process to their direct supervisor, through Health Quality BC's Disclosure of Wrongdoing Form or with Health Quality BC's Designated Officer. Individuals may additionally raise their concerns directly with the Office of the BC Ombudsperson.
